

- > HL7 Australia Ltd is a public company limited by guarantee
- > The liability of each of its Members is limited to an amount not more than \$10 to the property of the Company if the Company is wound up while the Member is a Member, or within 12 months after ceasing to be a Member
- > This contribution is required to pay for the debts and liabilities of the Company incurred before the Member ceased to be a Member, and/or the costs of winding up.




Active Committees Consensus Delivery Community Process




#### Returning Officer's report
